Additionally, Scott wrote for the *Dayton Daily News*, *Dayton City Paper* and was a syndicated columnist for Brown Newspapers, Inc.

Scott received a B.S. from Wright State University and an honors juris doctorate degree from the University of Dayton School of Law.
